Yes, the second we cry out we are heard. Yes, prayer is the direct line to God, yes, when all else fails prayer is the answer, and yes, like being stuck in traffic, it seems the answer is delayed and not coming fast enough.

Pastoral Search Committee Update- May 2023

Dear Church, I am bringing you a detailed update from our committee which began meeting at the end of November 2022 with our first goal being to create a process for us to follow as we start our search. In January, the committee sponsored a church workshop which was very successful with over 50 church members participating. Darnell and Tyra did an excellent job in preparing and executing this workshop then collecting the data. The data was used for the committee to create a church profile and job description.

Job description was posted on INDEED for the month of February which generated 28 candidates- many of these qualified out due to foreign location or denomination not a fit for our church. 4 resumes were received through church email. 1 resume received by US postal mail. Lancaster Search is a ministry search program that provides candidates to churches in need of a pastor. 14 resumes have been received from Lancaster. Job posting is active on 3 Seminary websites with 3 resumes received. Total resumes received and reviewed to date- 50.

In our process, applicants that we would like to interview must be vetted by Global Methodist first for them to be approved theologically. To date 2 have been approved and scheduled for zoom interviews with the pastoral search committee. Global is in the process of vetting 2 additional candidates, as soon as they are approved, we will schedule interviews. We are very excited to be in the interview process.

We have the opportunity to contract an Interim pastor to care for our church while the committee continues the pastor search. Church council voted in favor of contracting an interim pastor upon our recommendation. Interim definition - one called for a specific purpose and period of time to lead a congregation during the in-between times of installed pastoral leadership.

An interim would lead worship on Sunday mornings, be a leader to work with the office, personnel, church leadership and volunteers, make calls and visit with the ill, persons of need and prospective new members. Our greeters are welcoming visitors every Sunday morning so our interim pastor would extend the invitation for these guests to join the church at the conclusion of each service, this is very important during our transition period. The pastoral search committee is in communication with interim candidates. This decision is expected to be made by mid-May, expectations of the committee would be that the Interim would begin serving CMC June 1, 2023. We would like to thank each of you for all your support and prayers. We trust our God has chosen our Pastor and is preparing him for our church. We pray that OUR eyes, ears, and hearts are open to see what God is doing through this committee and in our church.

- 1 can hearts of palm, sliced
- 1 can artichoke hearts, chopped
- 2 large avocados, diced
- 1 large cucumber, seeded and diced
- 1 large red pepper, finely diced
- 2 mangoes, diced
- 1 red onion, finely diced
- 2 tbs fresh tarragon, chopped
- 1/4 fresh dill chopped
- 1/4 cup fresh parsley, chopped
- 2 tbs olive oil
- 1 orange, juiced
- 1 lemon, juiced
- 2 limes, juiced
- 2 tsp old bay seasoning
- 1 tsp salt and pepper



• Combine all the vegetables and herbs together in a large bowl and toss until combined. Pour over the olive oil, orange juice, lemon juice, lime juice, Old Bay, and the salt and pepper and toss. This will hold for a week in the fridge without the avocado's browning, it's basically magic. Serve with tortilla chips.
