We give thanks to our God! It is so amazing to see the hand of God in our life here at Coldspring Methodist Church. My last newsletter article announced the opportunity to hire an Interim pastor, well God changed our history. The Interim we were so interested in appointing turns out to be the full-time pastor God is calling to shepherd his church in Coldspring, Texas.

The Pastoral Search Committee is overjoyed to announce the appointment of our new pastor, Reverend David Dewitt. A little bit of his history; He retired from the UMC in 2021 after he walked with his church through the disaffiliation process from the United Methodist Church. He and his wife Becky moved from N. Carolina to Montgomery, Texas and made their new home in April Sound. His background includes a 35- year career in the Mil-Aero/DoD Industry where he retired as Director-level consultant for Software Engineering and Cost estimation and 12 years in the U.S. Marine Corps. (Disabled Veteran).

Upon retirement from UMC, David started a consulting business, Doxogenics LLC to support all facets of cost engineering and software and hardware development support. Currently provides cost evaluation support to NASA Science Office for Mission Assessments (SOMA). Reverend DeWitt has served as a Hospice Chaplain since relocating to Texas.
