Devotional

Who's/What's After You?

The Moabites, the Ammonites, and with them the Meunites came against Jehoshaphat to battle.

2 Chronicles 20:1 Alarmed, Jehoshaphat resolved to inquire of the Lord, and he proclaimed a fast for all Judah. The people of Judah came together to seek help from the Lord; indeed, they came from every town in Judah to seek him.

2 Chronicles 20: 3-4

The "ites" were after God's people. Who is after us? The "fear-ites", the "disease-ites", the "stressbites, or the "insecurity-bites"?

Whatever it is, we can learn from King J's response. The first thing he did was fear, but then he quickly set himself to seek the Lord. He even proclaimed a fast; he knew he needed to hear from God soon.

Like J, we need to develop the habit of running to God rather than to people or relying on our own wisdom when we have trouble. He may use a person to speak a word of advice to us, but we need to seek Him first.

J knew he needed to hear from God centuries ago and we have that same need today.

So, we need to ask God to Protect us from the "ites" in our lives.

Butternut Squash Soup Recipe

Equipment

- <u>5.5-Quart Dutch Oven</u>
- Blender

Ingredients

- 2 tablespoons <u>extra-virgin olive oil</u>
- 1 large yellow onion, chopped
- ½ teaspoon <u>sea salt</u>
- 1 (3-pound) butternut squash, peeled, seeded, and cubed
- 3 garlic cloves, chopped
- 1 tablespoon chopped fresh sage
- ¹/₂ tablespoon minced fresh rosemary
- 1 teaspoon grated fresh ginger
- 3 to 4 cups vegetable broth
- Freshly ground black pepper



Instructions

1. Heat the oil in a <u>large pot</u> over medium heat. Add the onion, salt, and several grinds of fresh pepper and sauté until soft, 5 to 8 minutes. Add the squash and cook until it begins to soften, stirring occasionally, for 8 to 10 minutes.

2. Add the garlic, sage, rosemary, and ginger. Stir and cook 30 seconds to 1 minute, until fragrant, then add 3 cups of the broth. Bring to a boil, cover, and reduce heat to a simmer. Cook until the squash is tender, 20 to 30 minutes.

3. Let cool slightly and pour the soup into a **<u>blender</u>**, working in batches if necessary, and blend until smooth. If your soup is too thick, add up to 1 cup more broth and blend. Season to taste and serve with parsley, pepitas, and crusty bread.
